Who can participate?

All secondary schools in Victoria are invited to participate. Up to 20 schools from metropolitan and regional Victoria will be selected to take part.

What do students have to do?

Students will prepare a short presentation that can focus on:

- building awareness of this year's theme
- providing a solution to address an issue related to the theme, or
- an idea to enhance community cohesion related to the theme

Student proposals will be presented to other participating schools, community leaders and politicians at the Summit. Presentations will be followed by a Q&A with politicians and other leaders.
