WHAT WE OFFER

STUDENT PROGRAMS

INTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS

Students from different schools come together to explore similarities and differences in beliefs and culture through experiential activities.

- Annually, bi-annually or per term
- Participating schools collaborate to co-host the program

INTERACTIVE PRESENTATIONS

Short, curriculum-linked presentations that explore themes of identity, belonging, faith, culture, stereotypes, prejudice, racism and more.

- 60-90 minute sessions
- For large and small groups
- Suitable for primary and secondary students

Presentations include:

- Assumptions & Stereotypes
- Cultural Celebrations
- Migration Stories
- Studies of Religion
- First Nations Perspectives
- Peace & Conflict
- Special event presentations, e.g. Harmony Day

MULTI-SESSION PROGRAMS

Intensive and highly interactive small group programs that support students to build confidence, develop empathy and establish respectful relationships with others.

- 5 x one-hour sessions
- Ideally for 12-15 students
- Years 6-12

Programs include:

- Identity & Values
- Relationships & Belonging
- Mindset & Resilience
- Cultural Diversity
- Bullying, Racism & Prejudice
- First Nations Perspectives
- Peace & Conflict
- CHAT (Cultural Hearing Asking Telling)

TEACHER PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

Teachers are equipped with the confidence and practical skills to enhance students' intercultural understanding and foster respectful, inclusive learning environments.

- 1-hour, 2-hour or half-day workshop
- Face-to-face or interactive webinar
- All courses linked to Australian Professional Standards for Teachers

Workshops include:

- Nurturing belonging in schools: Culturally responsive strategies to enhance belonging and inclusion
- Responding to racism and hurtful language in the classroom and playground
- Effective family engagement for CALD Students and their families
- Developing intercultural understanding: More than just Harmony Day

ONLINE LEARNING (FOR TEACHERS AND STUDENTS)

Online and on-demand modules that help schools navigate and celebrate diversity in their classrooms and communities. Teacher modules are linked to Australian Professional Standards for Teachers and student modules are curriculum linked.
