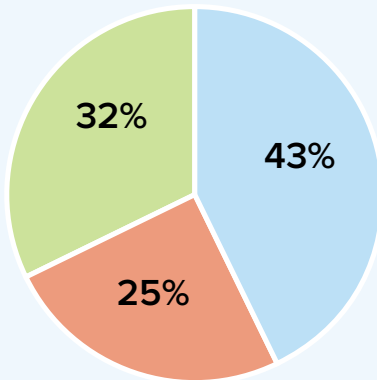

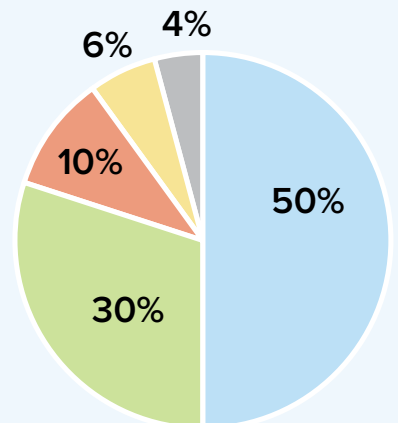
OUR WORK WITH STUDENTS AND TEACHERS IS SPLIT

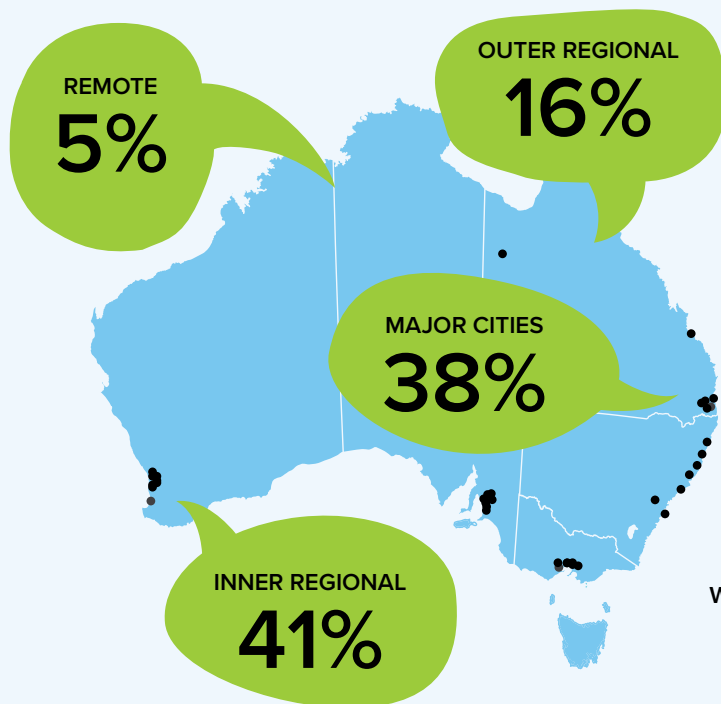

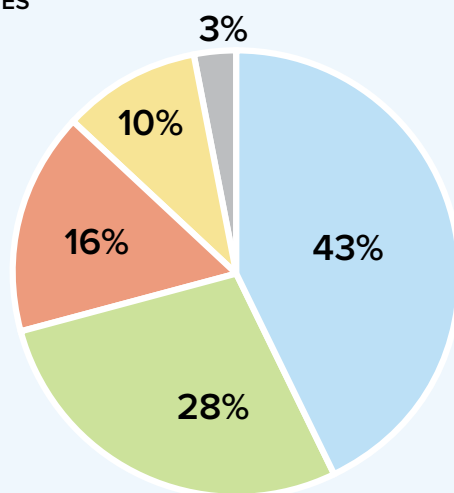

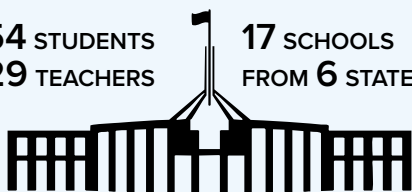
WE SUPPORTED SCHOOLS TO ADDRESS A BROAD RANGE OF CHALLENGES:

- 43% FIRST NATIONS PERSPECTIVES AND INCLUSION
- 28% CONNECTEDNESS FOR MULTICULTURAL SCHOOL COMMUNITIES
- 16% RESPONDING TO RACISM AND RELIGIOUS DISCRIMINATION
- 10% REFUGEE COMMUNITY INCLUSION AND SUPPORT
- 3% INCLUSION FOR OTHER MARGINALISED COMMUNITIES
