


Online Learning



The most **pressing issues** our partnership schools worked to address



- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural competency and inclusion 44%
- Multicultural connections and community engagement 23%
- Challenging racism, religious bigotry and other forms of discrimination 21%
- Migrant and refugee community inclusion and support 12%
